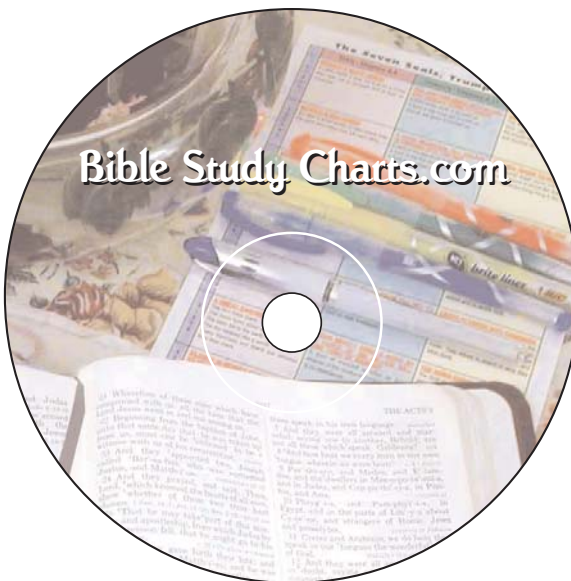

Alexander The Great

336--323 B.C.

The Large Horn of the Shaggy Goat of Greece (8:21)

Twenty-two years after Alexander's death, Greece was divided among four of his general (8:22)

Only **Ptolemy I Soter** and **Seleucus I Nicator** relate to Israel

Lysimachus

took Thrace and Bithynia

Cassander

took Macedonia

Ptolemy I Soter

took Egypt

Seleucus I Nicator

took Syria

* 2. Ptolemy II Philadelphus, 285-245 B.C. (11:6)

* 3. Ptolemy III Euergetes, 245-221 B.C. (11:7-9)

* 4. Ptolemy IV Philopator, 221-203 B.C. (11:11,12)

* 5. Ptolemy V Epiphanes, 203-181 B.C. (11:14,15, 17)

6. Ptolemy VI Philometor. 181-145 B.C. (11:25)

* *These kings ruled Israel*

Kings of the North - Syria

1. Seleucus I Nicator, 312-281 B.C. (11:5)

2. Antiochus I Soter (not referred to in Daniel)

3. Antiochus II Theos, 262-246 B.C. (11:6)

4. Seleucus II Callinicus, 246-226 B.C. (11:7-9)

5. Seleucus III Ceraunus, 226-223 B.C. (11:10)

* 6. Antiochus III the Great, 223-187 B.C. (11:10, 11, 13, 15-19)

* 7. Seleucus IV Philopator, 187-175 B.C. (11:20)

* 8. **Antiochus IV Epiphanes**, 175-163 B.C. (11:21-35)
(younger son of Antiochus III the Great)
